This report is submitted in accordance with the bylaws of Potomac Valley Swimming (PVS.)

First let me introduce myself: Kurt Thiel; I have been a member of PVS and USA Swimming for a number of decades, a certified official in Pool and Open Water Swimming at the Local, National and Championship level. I have training as a Safety Professional in the U.S. Navy and functioned as a Safety Officer; both Ground and Aviation. I am a currently certified Lifeguard, Waterfront Lifeguard and hold all other certifications to include Oxygen Delivery and Remote and Wilderness First Aid. I accepted the position in September of 2011 and have been working to get our Safety system in PVS to be among the best among the LSC's.

This revamp will be a difficult task since the position suffered during a number of short duration tenancies and finally in a "caretakers" acting appointment of an individual; John Ertter, who had numerous tasks to deal with in his primary function but still managed to stop the downward slide from hitting rock bottom.
